## MEASLES VACCINATION CAMPAIGN

The Abuja Municipal Area Council has rolled out a measles vaccination campaign for children from 9 months to 5 years old. There are 2 sessions available; 8<sup>th</sup> -13<sup>th</sup> February and 15<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> February 2018. The vaccination is safe, free and protects children from the virus.

*Did you know? Measles is a highly contagious vaccine preventable respiratory disease caused by measles virus. Measles affects children mostly under the age of 5 years and it can lead to death.*

*How is it spread? Measles is spread through droplet transmission from the nose, throat and mouth of an infected person with the virus.*

These droplets are released when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

What are the symptoms of Measles virus?

- Fever
- Cough
- Red eyes
- Runny nose
- Sore throat
- And others

What are the complications of Measles?

- Pneumonia

- Blindness
- Brain infection
- And others

How is measles prevented?

- Measles is prevented by immunization with measles vaccine.

As usual, we will send home the consent slip for the Early Years children who fall within that age band. The officials will be at our school after the mid- term break to immunize the pupils.
